Membership Report – Brian Reed: 41 memberships total., breakdown is 8 family, 7 lifetime, 6 honorary, and 20 regular. More membership cards will be needed soon; motion made to spend up to \$100 on new cards: Eli Whitney, second Rich Falcinelli; Jennifer Falcinelli suggested possibility of programming printing of the cards in house to save all the hand writing chores (names, numbers, president's signature); this will be examined by Mario as an alternative, if motion is passed. Motion carried. Brian also mentioned only a few MPR decals are left in stock; only brand new members or special member need will receive these in order to conserve the stock on hand.

Publicity – **Alexis Weber**: has plans aplenty, but will need help with some interviews (this means being interviewed) to keep up with news and information. The December issue had plenty of pizzazz, got kudos and applause (well deserved) from the peanut gallery!

Entertainment – Ray Dong: slides, pictures, and bench racing, all in the holiday spirit, tonight! Ray is planning another informative lecture from Dr. Sam Fullerton, marketing ace, this time about "Recovery Marketing", sort of a how to get back the customer you have lost in the past. This will again be pertinent info for our efforts to revive some local racing. Ray also thanked all for their efforts at the banquet, noting Alexis' efforts for the slide show, and the banquet committee (Kathleen and Mario Maraldo, Kathy and Royce Richards, Shelly and John Bridge II in the main).

Race Reports – Detroit, call Mark after the first of the year.

Quake – nothing new, pre pre-party report from Bob Wilson.

Walled Lake – Jennifer Falcinelli has some communications starting up, nothing newsworthy yet. Possibility of proceeding to a race this year is present, it is a wait & see process right now.

IRC news – Jim Sechler: Jim expounded on desires to simplify and correct rule book for inboard, needs cooperation and not so many rule changes. Too late there, he cited there are more than enough to go through at the January National Meeting.

Region 6 News – Barry: The Inboard BOD is making a cost proposal to the Evansville (Indiana) regatta being planned for Labor Day weekend to send over the region equipment, clock, flags, and Box 21 rescue. This aid will help that race immensely, as they have little or no infrastructure. It will also help the Inboard treasury with some needed racing revenues, if it all happens. Discussion continued with remarks by Jim Sechler and Mark Weber regarding getting boats to the race, needed communications through class reps, etc. Eli suggested strongly that that race committee (and actually, all race committees) spend a few \$\$ on mailing info on the race to boat owners to let them know a race is being planned and to solicit their commitment in support of the event.

National News: APBA has a new race insurance supplier, actually new old supplier, it is Hawk Racing Consultants, Rick Felsen managing. Savings in the range of 7.7% in event insurance (for Inboard) costs were derived by this change, good news for events.

The new caterer did a better job with food (plenty of it and warm); some comments were received regarding banquet room being a little cool; some thought into a new site may be given through the year.

A Few Highlights from Los Angeles

If you'd like to reference any of these proposals, they are located on apba.org under "Resources." I have included the control numbers below.

- Carter Parrish proposed that Rule 44.2.4 be removed that allows any boat meeting Rule 45 to be considered legal in 2.5 Mod class. His reasoning for this was that "this rule has allowed 5 Litres to run as a legal 2.5 Modified which has caused damage to multiple 2.5 modified boats and turned the heats into test sessions for the 5Litres. The holes left by the 5 litres in the water and the driving style of the 5 Litre (park and starts) is causing dangerous conditions and we need to remove them from our heats." The proposal passed, however, IRC voted that 350s are not eligible to step up for points. #2017-022
- New Super Comp Flatbottom class was approved.
- Howie Schnabolk proposed establishing a new "One-Final Per Event" format, as well as, new point structure. The proposal failed, however, a committee was formed due to the IRC's interest in exploring this idea for the future. If you'd like to read more on the proposal, it's control # 2017-022.
- Reducing the minimum number of boats for legal start from 4 to 3 was proposed again this year by Jim Aid (I believe he was also the one that proposed it last year?) Once again, it failed. #2017-007
- Jim Sechler's proposal to change the rules behind driver qualifications passed. Currently, the referees
 do not know who is and isn't qualified. This rule makes it the driver's responsibility to notify the referee if
 they are new to a class or re-qualifying. There are other modifications to the rule which can be seen
 online. Control #2017-024
- Katelyn Shaw proposed lowering the minimum head combustion chamber volume to 62cc in the SE class. Her reasoning for this was to "keep the cost down so that racers do not have to machine the parts to sink the valves, it would be necessary to lower the head cc. This would allow the cost of the motor to decrease in regards to labor fees and can help to incorporate someone who does not know a lot about motors, but wants to enter this entry-level class." This proposal was tabled until the next conference call. 2-17-017
- Don't forget new rule in effect for 2016: Audio communication between the spotter and driver are required during every heat. One-way radios are acceptable as long as the driver can hear the spotter.


A Piece from Publicity
