Meeting at Bayside Sports Grille, Walled Lake, Michigan called to order by Eli Whitney at 8:20 P.m. No 50-50 drawing this month (for logistical reasons).

General announcements: Eli called for a moment of silence in memory of the passing on May 9, 2010, of Ira Tuvell, longtime supporter of powerboat racing. Best wishes to Tim Hueston who has apparently been approved for surgery thanks to the efforts of many, including Bob Dombrowski. Enthusiastic thanks to John Senna, Bayside proprietor and Walled Lake Thunder sponsor for providing this month's meeting location.

Approval of Minutes: of May 3, 2010 General Meeting Motion to approve by Ray Dong. Seconded by Cadi Reiss. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Mario Maraldo listed expenditure of \$24.00 for website costs, leaving a balance of \$11,454.52. Motion to Approve by Andy Guaresimo. Seconded by Sam Anspach. No discussion. Motion approved unanimously. Membership stands at 89.

Publicity: Brian Reed announced that the new MPR website is up and running and publicizing MPR events. Race teams are strongly urged to list their team/boat information.

Entertainment: Ray Dong announced his "executive decision" to delete entertainment / speaker for this month's meeting to concentrate on the preparation and details of the Walled Lake Thunder event. Ray introduced Sandy Ross who is organizing a tribute to the Schoenith's and Gale racing exploits from 1950 – 1975. This presentation will cover the history of the boats, the drivers, the family – including the joys and sorrows. Schoenith family and former drivers will be available to answer questions. Free hor's douvres with a cash bar will be available.

Race Reports:

Walled Lake Thunder June 12, 13, 2010 Todd McQuade introduced and thanked John Senna, sponsor of the third annual race on Walled Lake. Todd presented the record course survey map and pointed out the new start/finish location. Todd also mentioned the highly welcome and appreciated effort of Jim Sechler to acquire the services of the Swamp Thing, a mechanical weed harvester which will work to clear the course entry lanes and hopefully eliminate any boat water intake / prop fouling issues. Buoys are planned to be set out, with inspections taking place Friday and Saturday. Three cranes are scheduled for use, with two at dockside and one in reserve for inspections and emergency mechanical issues. A newly designed race program is in the works, thanks in part to Royce and Kathy Richards. Also acknowledged were Joe Tate, Nancy Spanich, Don Nicholson, and many others too numerous to mention for their support. Sam Anspach described the logistics for boat launching and retrieval. Jennifer Grigg reviewed the boat registration times and procedures on Friday night and Saturday morning. Also mentioned was the Saturday evening "boat team" buffet provided at Bayside. Cost is \$10.00 per person.

Waterford/ Quake on the Lake July 15-18 Bob Dombrowski reviewed the changes and enhancements to the Quake this year, including the move to a four day event with two days of racing (Saturday and Sunday), overnight camping availability at the boat launching area, no tow vehicles or motor homes in the pit area, the enforcement of safety rules in the hot and cold pit areas, 21 carnival rides, musical entertainment, and much more.

Summertime, and the livin' is easy, or so the song goes. Inboard racing is back in full swing, with area events being held at Walled Lake and (stretching the map a little) Syracuse, New York. John Semma's Bayside Grille team put on a whale of a show June 21 and 13, with about 40 racing boats in action. Paul Poledink has summed up the weekend, see his report elsewhere in the newsletter. Thanks John, Todd, Jim, Andy, and a host of others!

Tim Hueston has had his operation and made it to the races that weekend. That's one tough customer, no doubt. Couldn't stay away, a true measure of passion for the sport and for his friends. We talked to him the day after the operation, which was amazing by itself to me. See Tina Wilson at some of the races for extra info on Tim, she's got something going. Keep him in mind, there's still a long road ahead in recovery.

Syracuse, New York, for me a return to almost home (I'm an appleknocker of NY's Mohawk Valley region), certainly familiar ground for motorsports activity, but mainly for cars. This city, on the shores of Onondaga Lake, situated on the ancient capital of the Iroquois League (the Six Nations, which is the model for our national government), years ago also heard the thunder of racing boats. This year, 2010, marked the second annual renewal of inboard boat racing on the lake, hosted by the Central NY Hydroplane club. How many boats? Eighty-six (86). Everyone raced. Everyone raced hard. Great time, hot weather for three days (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday). Friday was perfect, seeing three classes compete for their Eastern Divisional titles. There was a little wind on Saturday that allowed only the bigger boats to run, but Sunday saw around 26 heats (sorry, lost count, all I know is GP's were second to last and GNH last, plenty of thunder on the water) total being contested. See Tim Collin's writeup for details. MPR was well represented in the racing activity! Headline here: you read it first here, or maybe last, Sechler's boat got beat on Sunday. Win streak is kaput. No human error that I could see, just good competition, as Joe Sovie and Sean Bowsher finished one-two ahead of Jim and Dan. Pressure is off, if I were the rest of the Y class, I'd look out, as I am sure this challenge will be answered at Waterford's Quake!

Speaking of the Quake, this year's Quake 11 (July 17-18) is shaping up fast. Check out the circular, note the special entertainments and the camping news for motorhomes. The crew is not afraid to make positive adjustments to this premier event, right Mary Anne? Note also from the circular: next year, the Quake will award Inboard Hydro National Championships, keep this in mind.

Detroit's Gold Cup is up and coming, too, the weekend prior (July 9-10-11) finds the Unlimited Hydros racing for the APBA Gold Cup, the oldest motorsports contest in the world and the premier boat racing title anywhere. Mark Weber, Tom Bertolini and the DRRA crew have been feverishly preparing for the event, with cleanup activities needing volunteers still going on as you read this note. Several Prop Riders have donated time and efforts for this cleanup, join in, it will be appreciated (Mark provides refreshments!)!! This year's event which comes the weekend after Madison, Indiana's traditional regatta should find great competition on the unruly Detroit River Belle Island course.

Don't forget, also, some of our 5 Litre racers will be in Marietta, Ohio for racing that same weekend, and if you find yourself too far from Detroit and closer to Marietta, well, go support our guys on the Ohio River! We'll wish each of them a "good luck" right here and be safe, be ready and be on time (to borrow a phrase heard from time to time).

Rest of July: locally, Trenton outboard and tunnel boat races (World Championships on the line) July 24-25, and off-shores in St. Clair that same weekend. For Inboards, the combined APBA and CBF Inboard Nationals and World Championships are in Cambridge, Maryland July 23,24, and 25; a number of MPR members will contest for these championships that weekend, so if you feel like a little trip, the host club has planned plenty of racing and Chesapeake Bay hospitality! We'll be there!

Walled Lake Thunders On . . . But Without "Thunder"

Under the ominous threat of thunder (and lightning and rain) which never materialized, the third annual Walled Lake Thunder Inboard Hydroplane Races roared to success June 12-13 in Walled Lake, Michigan just north of Detroit. Hydro owners, drivers, crew, and family members made the short trip to Michigan from nearby Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois, while others journeyed from as far away as Virginia, New York, Kentucky, Louisiana, Florida, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Delaware, and Ontario, Canada.

Fortunately for the fans, the owners and drivers, the race venue volunteers, and the race sponsor John Semma's **Bayside Sports Grille**, the only thundering sounds were generated by the 40 limited class hydros which travelled to Walled Lake to compete on the 1 mile world record certified course. The cloud cover remained for most of the two day weekend event, but it became clear to everyone Saturday evening that UV rays *do* penetrate water vapor and can result in some serious sunburn. Friday, June 11 saw the first boats arrive at the pits around noon – only to see a strong southerly breeze – make that wind – that kicked up whitecaps on the normally calm lake surface. "You're not going to get me out and run on that water" one early arriver observed. By nightfall about 25 boats were bedded down in the paved parking lot of the **Bayside Grille**, but by noon Saturday, all 40 registered boats were strategically placed around the two dockside cranes.

The wind did subside and remain relatively calm on Saturday and Sunday, which led to some extremely competitive crowd-pleasing sponson-to-sponson racing in the various class heats. While the course was record certified, no new speed records were set, possibly because of the high humidity levels and the "sticky" water surface.

The 40 boat field included six 1 Litre Mod Y boats, four 1.5 Litre Stock T's, eight 2.5 Litre Mod A's, ten 2.5 Litre Stock S's, seven 5 Litre E's, and five 7 Litre GNH's. Billy Noonan chaired the 10:00 AM drivers meeting, with commentary by Don Melillo, Chief Referee, Jennifer Grigg, Scorer, and Todd McQuade, Event Chairman. Racer Bob Dabrowski provided details regarding the continuing battle waged by Tim Hueston, longtime race supporter, to overcome his battle with cancer. Following an hour of testing by rookie drivers, coming-out-of-retirement or class-switching drivers, and coming-out-of-hibernation boats, the first of four weekend qualifying and final heats began at 12:30 PM. (The testing must have paid off – four of the first timers won trophies over the weekend!)

Some highlights and sidelights of the Walled Lake Thunder weekend included

- A clean but not mean weekend of racing. There were no incidents of any concern, just straight-forward enjoyable and competitive racing activities for the drivers, crews, owners, fans, and sponsor.
- The continued dominance of 1Litre Y boats by Jim Sechler and Dan Kanfoush in **Fast Eddie Too.** This boat is really on a tear.
- The support of Walled Lake Thunder by teams from the East Coast and from down South. Their participation is highly appreciated by APBA Region 6 members and the Marine Prop Riders.
- Seeing the return of Joe Kreitzer and Gregg Barker after several years. It's good to have the Old-timers? Veterans? Experienced? take part in the races with the new crop of younger drivers, male and female.
- Watching Cadi Reiss fling the GNH **One Way** around the course lap after lap on Sunday in a display of how the bigger hydros can thrill the fans and the other drivers, crews and owners. She's back.

- The successful performance of Keith Anderson's 2.5 Litre Stock **Bad Habit** in a field of ten highly competitive and closely matched boats.
- Witnessing and measuring the aggressive development of 2.5 Litre Mod boats as they increase their groups' performance. **Old Crow, Mr Budd, Fat Chance II, Southern Magic-** what a show.
- Sharing with Sean Bowsher his disappointment and his good natured acceptance of losing a prop blade during Sunday's run. "Anyone want what was once a very expensive piece of machined metal but is now just a neat paperweight?"
- Catching a glimpse of the words on the transom of **Dancing Queen**, Tina Wilson's 2.5 Litre Stock as it goes by you: "You've just been passed by a Grandma"
- The cooperation, support, and charm of a small community and an enthusiastic sponsor without which there wouldn't be the sound of Thunder.
