May finds racing plans being put into operation all over. Race sites are busy working on their race, finding volunteers, officials, etc. Volunteers are still needed urgently at every race, for us in Michigan, that means Walled Lake and Waterford. They need turn judges ahead of time, not the day of the race (or the day after).

The MPR BOD has met the last two months to discuss at length a major issue which impacts this club and APBA: dwindling membership. A proposal will be made at this next regular meeting to change our fees for new members in certain situations: first, at our races this summer, any brand new member buying a membership for \$20 (regular price) will receive a free pit pass for the weekend (MPR will square the proceeds with the race committee); also any race volunteer who is not a current or recent MPR member will be offered a membership for half price (\$10) for their first year. These moves are proposed to obtain new club members, basically from individuals who are interested already to some degree but do not realize what the club offers. From any of these new members, we also may have some also join APBA due to the involvement with boat racing. We are trying to grow the club, which in turn can generate new membership for APBA. Will it work? We won't know unless we try.

We will also have club membership forms for those racers who don't have a club (owners and drivers) or a club card at registration.

You might ask, why would newbies (or even boat owners / drivers without cards) join MPR? Well, for one thing, our newsletter is second to none. Pertinent race circulars are in each issue as available and appropriate, which helps racers know where and where to go, and also helps the race sites get the word out to racers, as circulars do not have to be mailed out by a race site. Results are printed as available, along with news and views from APBA nationally, Inboard Racing Commission, and Region 6.

Our annual awards are also second to none. Great trophies and recognition for Hi-point class winners and high achievers both nationally and local. Our banquet is growing, with racer friendly cost and site, with additional features being considered for the banquet day / weekend. Our meetings a regular (monthly) and open to all, guests are always welcome.

Our web site has undergone quite a bit of modification by Brian Reed, he certainly deserves congratulations and thanks for this job. A considerable amount of skill and time go into these changes, and these seem to be right on the mark. Club boat owners, listen up: there is a need for info for each club boat. Only a couple teams are on line now. Mary Anne Wilson has pledged all the info from last year's Quake program, which can help, but for those who aren't part of that package, we can use info now.

One might ask if our boat displays work, a legitimate question when you think of the work which goes into organizing and putting the boats in a show. I received a phone call from Louisiana, from Randy English (on behalf of he and his dad); it seems the English's had a visitor from Detroit to work on their motors a bit. This visitor went on and on about his positive impression of the club Autorama display and the members manning the area, of their knowledge and excitement for boat racing. The visitor: Mr. Kinsler of Kinsler Fuel Injection, who is the real world expert in that field and extremely knowledgeable about motorsports. Mr. Kinsler had ample opportunity to look at and speak of all kinds of fancy stuff down at Cobo Hall that weekend, yet he chose to single out the MPR display. Kudos for this club and those involved. This also says that we are noticed and would be missed if we did not make these efforts.

These factors are positives for the club, they are reasons to join. Our biggest factor is our membership itself. We have a very knowledgeable and experienced membership in regards to boat racing, whether it is historical or current. We need to be willing to mentor these new members when they appear to keep them with us and become a part of this club, the oldest Inboard club in APBA.

Speaking of new, let's welcome into the club two new boats and possibly a third: Andrew Christopher, who was Region 6 ROY in 2009, with his A boat (2.5L mod) (I think this is a new boat to the club); Chris Ritz, a new old member whose dad raced boats in the 70's and 80's, now has a Y boat (1L mod) built by Scott Liddycoat; and not a new member but a new boat to the club is Jeff Sankuer's E boat (5L stock), the former Intruder from Louisiana (Nicky Pellerin), recently purchased and delivered to Jeff, in beautiful shape, in Jeff's black color scheme (Jones hull, Auld cell). Nothing wrong with additional boats on the roster!


