# MEETING MINUTES

## Marine Prop Riders – General Meeting – April 6th – Meeting Minutes

**Meeting:** At Juliano's Restaurant in Warren. Called to order by John Grigg at 7:35 P.M. 50-50 drawing this month conducted by Stephanie Nettke.

**President's Report** Vice President John Grigg is chairing **this** month's meeting due to the fact of MaryAnne Wilson's winter trip to Florida. New MPR members were recognized by the Chair: Dave, Kevin, and John, who all joined at the Novi Boat Show.

**Approval of Minutes:** of March 2, 2011 General Meeting. Motion to approve Todd McQuade, seconded by Stephanie Nettke. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

**Treasurer's Report:** Mario Maraldo reported the March financial activities as \$252.55 for Newsletter, \$12.58 for Autorama, \$258.02 for MPR Business Cards, \$657. 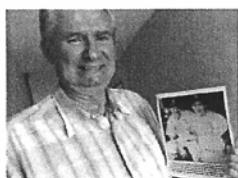
## BILL ROMANOWSKI, ART "PINKY" DERAS, TOM D'EATH AND STAN JAVIE TO BE INDUCTED INTO THE NATIONAL POLISH-AMERICAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME.

39<sup>TH</sup> CLASS INDUCTION BANQUET SET FOR THURSDAY, JUNE 23, 2011, TROY, MI

The National Polish-American Sports Hall of Fame expands its roster to 123 honored members this year, with the addition of four new inductees, as **Bill Romanowski** and **Art "Pinky" Deras**, top vote-getters in the NPASHF 2011 national balloting process, are joined by **Tom D'Eath** and **Stan Javie**, to make up the stellar Class of 2011. All four inductees will be honored at the **39<sup>th</sup> Annual Induction Banquet on Thursday, June 23 2011**, at the American Polish Cultural Center in Troy, MI. Longtime Detroit radio personality **Tom Ryan** will serve as Master of Ceremonies for the event.



**Bill Romanowski**, a third round pick by San Francisco in 1988 out of Boston College, went on to an outstanding 16 year career in the NFL. The tough, hard-nosed linebacker played an incredible 243 consecutive games, an NFL record at that position, winning four Super Bowl Championships. He is the only linebacker to start five Super Bowl games, and is one of only three players to win back-to-back Super Bowls with two different organizations. With a reputation as a fanatic trainer and aggressive competitor, Romo did not miss a game in his 16 year career. The two-time Pro Bowl selection ended his career with Oakland in 2003.



**Art "Pinky" Deras** is arguably the greatest Little League baseball player of all time. In 1959, Pinky and his Hamtramck, MI teammates reached the Little League World Series having won nine of ten tournament games by shutout. In the finals, Deras tossed a one-hit, 5-0 shutout against Puerto Rico, hit a grand slam in a 7-1 victory over Hawaii, and threw a three-hit 12-0 victory over West Auburn, CA in the championship game. Deras' single-season pitching statistics were staggering; 18 starts, 18 complete game victories, 16 shutouts, 10 no-hitters, 298 strikeouts (only 26 outs in the field), and just 10 walks in 108 innings. At the plate, he hit

.641 for the season, with 33 home runs and 112 RBI. Two years later, Deras led Hamtramck to the Pony League World Series Championship.



**Tom D'Eath** has excelled in the sport of hydroplane racing as a famed driver, designer, and builder. As a driver, he has won national championships in nearly every class of hydroplane racing. He is the winner of three APBA Gold Cups (1976, '89 and '90) and added Prince Edward Canadian Gold Cup titles in 1974, '76 and '80. He remains the only three-time winner of both. In 1988, Tom was named APBA "Outstanding Driver" while piloting the famous Miss Budweiser. When he retired in 1991, D'Eath was sixth on the all-time list of unlimited victories with 16. He was inducted into the Unlimited Hydroplane Hall of Fame in 1997, the Michigan Motor Sports Hall of Fame in 1998, and the Motor Sports Hall of Fame of America in 2000.



**Stan Javie** enjoyed a remarkable 29-year career as an official in the National Football League. From 1951 until his retirement in 1980, Stan was considered to be one of the NFL's premier officials, despite being one of the few on-field officials to wear eyeglasses. As a back judge, Javie officiated in four Super Bowls (Super Bowl II, VIII, X and XIV), becoming one of the first NFL officials to achieve such a distinction. His last game worked prior to his retirement was Super Bowl XIV in 1980. Today, son Steve carries on the high officiating standard set by his father, as a highly-respected National Basketball Association referee. Stan Javie passed away in 2002.

Tickets for the banquet, which begins at 6 p.m., are \$85, and include an open bar and traditional Polish family-style dinner. Tickets can be ordered by calling (313) 407-3300. ## *Patrick Sankuer Jr.*

### ***Personal Information:***

**History:** Why did you get into hydroplane racing and how long? Our Family has been attending the Gold Cup as long as I can remember. My parents owned a marina so we were always around the water. In 1974 my father bought his first race boat, a five liter. It was Black with flames and a mouse on the front! At the time it was the coolest thing I had ever seen (not long after that I think it may have changed to Linda Carter in her Wonder Woman costume!) He repainted it and ran it as Stars and Stripes. In 1976 it ran as Spirit of 76. He even built me a homemade out board when I was a kid.

**When and where did you drive your first hydroplane race boat?** My father took me out in the 5 liter in 1975 in Anchor Bay when I was 6.

**How did you acquire your current hydroplane and where did it come from?** Ron Jones built it for Dick Schneider. It was purchased from him in 1992 after I had barrel rolled the first 7 liter called "Showtime"

**What is your most memorable moment in hydroplane racing?** I would say the final heat on Sunday at Stony Creek. We ran real hard with Thommy Heins and Randy Hurst for 4 laps, the boat handled really bad but it was our first real win. It was great! My back still hurts! HA! HA!

**What was your greatest heat in racing?** Up to this point the Stony Creek final.

**Who helps you at the races and in the shop?** Patrick Sr., Caroline, Sara, Marty M, Uncle Bob, Gracey, Katie, my brother Jeff and sometimes Kevin McGregor, Mario, Einar and Jimmy King have always been a big help.

**What is your most memorable traveling experience?** We were not able to race at Hillsboro a few years back so I drove down to Kentucky to pick up an RTM machine that week end. It just so happened that Dutch Squires blew over and a bunch of us we able to fix it for him to go out and run. He won the championship that year! It was just a fluke I was there to help.

**What do you want to accomplish this racing season?** To get the boat to handle better, faster

**What are your accomplishments in boat racing?** GNH National High Champion 2009, 1<sup>st</sup> place Stony Creek, numerous 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishes. Region 6 1995 high point champ.

**What would you change about racing?** To have it run like a business

**What would you not want to change about racing?** The Flying Start!

**What is your favorite race course?** Detroit

**What is something no one knows about you?** I am one quarter French Canadian (Will this help in Valleyfield?)

**What are your other hobbies?** I really enjoy playing music with my brother when we have time, I teach guitar when my schedule permits and practicing classical guitar is something I try to do every day. I restore/refinish guitars, Building model rockets is always cool. I enjoy seeing bands live in all different styles of music. Watch way too much History channel.
