Tom English and Dave Archiable did a bang-up job bring the new committee into being and the results are impressive! Here are some names for reference: Mary Anne Wilson, Don Melillo, Ron Snyder, Steve Spisak, Jim Sechler, Jennifer Grigg, Dennis Bowsher, Dean Armstrong, Joe Johnson, Phil Mitchell, Rich Falcenelli, and Kevin Gilday! Oh, yeah, the pits. The pits are always a chore at Rocky Fork, and this year, most spots were preplanned, and it worked! Great crane work with organized traffic control from the lower pits to the upper pits made things move along! More names: Sam and Rachel Anspach, Tim Heuston, Dennis Bowsher! Box 21 and Rick Wickline had some work to do, but all ended well!

An aside, Don Melillo is ailing, and we all wish him well and support him! Somewhat linked to Don's circumstances, Bill Shea received a lung transplant one year ago, and to celebrate his gift of life, Bill and Bobbi donated some contingency prize monies for this weekend, promoting the Donate For Life program, with stories, conversation, stickers, and pins. Great to see Bill and Bobbi, all decked out in their race uniform stars and stripes shirts from 1997! An individual decision, signing up to be an organ donor is as easy as checking a box on your driver's license renewal or by checking it out on the internet, please consider it!

Vintage boats were invited, and a strong field took up the challenge. A number of beautiful boats took to the water in three separate heats, safely and proudly revisiting old times of hydro racing. To mention only a few does not do justice to the field, but some of these were the *Sir Ron* E-boat, the Beth Gilday / Billy Noonan's *Lil Miss Hillwinds*, Phil Mitchell's beauty out of Minnesota, and Phil Kunz's E-66 *Helter Skelter*, driven in competition by the late Jim Kropfeld, and driven this weekend ably by Ron Snyder. Incidentally, Ron sez he wished he had been able to drive the Skelter back then, he'd have won a lot more races! Might even have gotten famous!

OK, time for the racing. The show began with timed hot laps on Saturday morning. The water was fast, oh my! Record setting speeds were recorded, leading to much anticipation for the racing the rest of the weekend! Leading the way was the NM-100 with Chuck Miller piloting (driving? The way that thing flew, piloting!) this black beauty to a lap speed of over 111 mph (NM record is 108)! That was just getting ready for the weekend racing, too!

Y class – Nine 1L Mods raced; Y-1 the victor. The racing was very close, and the dynamic duo of Jim Sechler/Dan Kanfoush, with the help of the competent Y-1 crew, had to be on the top of their game, both days. Becky Wilson shucked a sponson in the first heat Saturday; Jeff Mauer's Y-16 orange crate looked good with Kathleen driving, but encountered some transom troubles (prop blade broke and shook the transom apart, fixed it, ran on Sunday!); Chris Ritz and Canadian racer Andre Rouseau had their troubles all weekend; Joe Sovie overcame Saturday difficulties to run on Sunday. Sean Bowsher raced a strong 2nd place on Saturday, but faded on Sunday. Marty Hammersmith came on real strong, 3rd Saturday and finishing a very close second on Sunday, the Y-4 has really come on this year! Bob Weaver's famous Y-563 Lobsterboat (Chuck Miller in the seat) came in from Raleigh, North Carolina to wind up 4th and 3rd. Overall: Y-1, Y-4, Y-563, Y-52, Y-16, Y-44

S class – Seven 2.5L Stocks saw action this weekend, with boats coming from Ohio, Michigan, Virginia, New Jersey, and New York. Virginia's Doug Martin (S-33) to be the king of the qualifiers (both days), but the finals were taken by New Jersey's Joe Longo in the S-146 *Lil Electron* (thank you Willard, look to see you sometime soon!) over Mike Monahan in Greg Barker's S-9 *Honey Bun* (both days!). Tina Wilson in her S-20 ran consistently all weekend, while Scott Thompson continues to build up points in his S-41 *Second Choice*. Keith Fickert in Joe Kreitzer's conventional hulled S-67 *Impossible Dream* finished a strong 3rd on Saturday's final, good job by the rookie! Scott Anderson and Myron Buxton continue their efforts with the S-38 from the Celina, Ohio area, finishing a couple heats and making progress! Overall: S-146, S-9, S-20, S-41, S-33, S-67, S-38

E class – Eight 5L Stocks raced in twin qualifiers, with Joe Less in the E-500 *Centsless 14* (Don Less' current craft) winning one Saturday and Sunday, and Tom English (E-75) and John Jenkins (E-32) the other qualifier, Saturday and Sunday, respectively. The Saturday final went to Joe Less, but the Sunday final went to Stover Hire's E-37 *Hire Voltage* with nephew Colby Denman piloting. With this, his first win, Colby got thrown in the lake to cool off his

hot work! Congratulations! Joe Sovie in Doug Benyon's Louisiana based E-61 *Ragin' Cajun*, Illinois' Mark Manos (E-51), and rookie Kyle Roskowski in Scott Blackwell's Indiana based E-617 all ran strong and steady this weekend; the long tow award (if there was one) goes to Mike and Mike from Colorado, Mike Schroder and Mike Hopkins, with the E-23, who ran well on Saturday, but found Sunday a little more challenging. A class – Eight 2.5L Mods honored the memory of Joe Tate this weekend. The George English / Royce Richards, Randy English prepared pairs were present, but the drivers were different! With the regulars out (one hurt and one practicing his driving skills in San Diego), Dan Kanfoush (A-52) and Stevie Kuhr (A-25) put the pair through their paces. Results: Dan in the A-52 *Fat Chance* won all four heats contested, while Stevie in the A-25 *Fat Chance II* had a pair of 2nds in the qualifiers, with a 3rd in Saturday's final (not bad for the very first time in that potent radical Staudacher hull!). Joe Sovie gained the runner up spot for both finals in Debbie Welte's A-23 *Geozerboat*; the Essingler four cylinder just singing a high RPM song! Tom Bergman in Mike Cashin's World Champ A-8 ran steady all weekend, with Doug Martin in George English's A-7 getting some mod experience on Saturday; Kevin Kreitzer in Joe's A-64 had a rough Saturday, but ran strong on Sunday, finding some light at the end of that tunnel he's been in! Maryland's Gregg Isaac 's A-47 with Bobby Kennedy aboard had a rough weekend, but ran one heat very well, while Florida's Jim Aid in A-33 had an even rougher weekend, but without any serious damage, just operational maladies of the immediately incurable kind. Overall: A-52, A-8, A-25, A-23, A-7, A-64, A-47, A-33

National Modified class – NM's were five strong, Lem Thompson's black beauty NM-200, with Chuck Miller piloting, took 'em all to school on Saturday and in the Sunday qualifier. Joe Sovie in Mike Wiener's NM-81 grabbed the Sunday final, not bad for Joe's first ride in this potent machine! Scott Blackwell in the Wolfe Racing Engine powered NM-83 *Desperado*, owned by Dennis Johnson, ran consistently all weekend, finishing as runner up in each final. Don Burshnick (Maine, New York) in his own NM-27 worked hard and was rewarded with 3rd place in Sunday's final. NM-100 *Sumtoy3* spun in the Saturday final, holed the hull, and promptly sunk, much to the chagrin of Tony Black! Tom Newman was pretty calm about it, nobody hurt, not an upside down episode, but a bunch of work. The crew dried it out, fired the motor by Sunday afternoon, and found only a hole (pretty big one, at that) in the hull. They headed home promising to make Geneva the next weekend! Both the A-52 (G. English / R. Richards / Dan Kanfoush driver) and A-64 (J. Krietzer / Kevin Kreitzer driver) also entered the NM class to help keep the NM hi-points war going, kudos for these extra efforts! Overall: NM-93, NM-200, NM-81, NM-27, NM-100, A-52, A-64

Grand Prix – John Grigg brought the *Dad's Dream 2* GP-52 for some hot laps, and the hills reverberated with the sounds of the supercharged big block Chevy, wowing the throng and reminding all that GP's are cool at Rocky Fork!

Grand National Hydroplane – GNH brought in 8 boats, a strong field. Cal Phipps showed up, along with point leader Jim Martin, Cadi Riess, Steve Kuhr, Alex Findlow with a trio of boats, and Butch Nace. For Saturday, twin qualifiers were run, with Cal (GNH-41 *Too Hot*) taking the first by a nose over Joe Kreitzer (GNH-515 *One Way*) and Jim Martin (GNH-43 Keen's Villain), with Stevie Kuhr (GNH 317 Irishman) showing the way in the second, except a one minute penalty dropped him to second behind Dave Archiable (GNH-777 Pat Rankin owned Cajun Queen). The final found Cal victorious over Kuhr and Cadi, winning the Dan Walls Memorial. This memorial race for long time Region 6 racer Dan Walls (Sr.) will be contested each year at Rocky Fork in the GNH class, with the winner's name and boat inscribed each year on a perpetual trophy. Cal was very much honored by receiving this award from the Walls family. Sunday found a three boat consolation heat, with Jarrod Walls (GNH-33 Tennessean) leading the way over Butch (GNH-29 Nace's Ace) and dad Dan Walls, Jr. (GNH-68), leaving a five boat field for the final. The final: a real barnburner to close out the weekend, with Cal winning, but having to hold off a pair of fast closing hydros, Kreitzer and Kuhr, with Martin and Dave Archiable 4th and 5th respectively. Kreitzer just nosed out Kuhr at the finish, as those two boats were deck to deck all race, closing on Cal. Cal got his lead on the first lap going off the near turn, and was never able to stretch it out at all. The two K's were even from there on out. Five boats went into turn one darn near side by side, that's tons of water thrown in the air! This great race closed out the racing weekend in spectacular style! Overall: GNH-41, GNH-515, GNH-317, GNH-777, GNH-43, GNH-68, GNH-33, GNH-29





In the 1980's, Andy dove in Lake Superior with the Canadian Navy Seals to the Wreck of the Edmond Fitzgerald, which is 534 feet down.

He got his start in off shore racing as a throttleman 35 years ago, but has been involved with racing for over 40 years. Andy has worked The Gold Cup for over 25 years and has collaborated with Racer Bob Dabrowski from the very beginning for both The Quake and The Streak. He has been a member of MPR since 1991 and had been Vice President three years and Member-at-Large for four years. He also handled the Autorama and the Boat Shows for both MPR and DRRA for over five years.

Andy has been on the Board of Directors for The Jefferson Yacht Club, is a member of St. Clair Shores Eagles, AmVets #121, Moose Lodge (Celina, OH) as well as a volunteer for the Parade Company. He is a Team Leader for Medical and Communications for the marathons. He also works for the Free Press Marathon in the same capacity.
